

FRIENDS OF THE PARK FUND

The Mission of the Friends of the Park Fund is to create an ongoing source of financial support for a variety of projects in the North Tahoe Regional Park, and other park facilities in our District, that have been identified in the Recreation and Parks Master Plan.

This fund was created in 2008 by the North Tahoe Public Utility District Board of Directors upon recommendation of the Recreation and Parks Commission.

Funds generated by the Friends of the Park augment the budget of the Recreation and Parks Department to address unmet needs. Current identified priority projects include: adult and children's playground equipment, nature trail restoration, par course restoration, improved park signage, Ramada restoration, track and field facility, completion of ballfield 5, kayak and canoe storage, and tennis court enhancements. The Friends of the Park Fund is an established Donor Advised Fund with the Truckee Tahoe Community Foundation (TTCF). Since incorporating in 1998, the Foundation has managed more than \$5 million for local organizations working to improve our community. PARKS & FACILITIES

The North Tahoe Parks Department is a department of the North Tahoe Public Utility District. It originated in 1968 through Board action. Over the past three decades, the Parks Department has evolved into its current stewardships, including District, County, State, and Federal properties that are displayed on these pages. The North Tahoe Parks Department offers extensive recreational opportunities. Facilities have been made possible through acquisition contracts, grants, property exchanges, and an exceptionally supportive community.

CONTRACTED SERVICE PROVIDERS

North Tahoe Winter Adventures operates the District's sled hill and snowmobile track rides through the winter months, as snow levels allow. Sled and snowmobile rentals are available. For more information, call **(530) 546-0605.** This phone is only operable during the winter months when North Tahoe Winter Adventures is in operation.

Tahoe Adventure Company provides summer and winter recreation opportunities for residents and visitors. Kayak rentals and tours are available at Tahoe Vista Recreation Area at the corner of Highway 28 and National Avenue. They also lead a variety of kayak, mountain bike, and winter snowshoe tours, and they organize team building events for corporate business. 



ABOUT THE PARK

The North Tahoe Regional Park is located about one mile west of Highway 267 and one mile north of Highway 28 in Tahoe Vista. The Regional Park encompasses 124 acres and provides opportunity for both active and passive recreation. Accessible public lands surround the Regional Park on three

Reservations may be made up to one year before the date requested for the upcoming season.

The Ramada is a covered picnic area with seating for approximately 100 people. Amenities include a sink and running water, BBQ pit, and electricity. This is a great location for casual weddings and receptions, rehearsal dinners, family and high school reunions, graduation parties, or other events.

Ballfields, soccer field, tennis courts, disc golf course, and all the other facilities at the Park are available for rent for tournaments, family reunions, youth or adult skills camps, and other events.

Llewellyn Scout Camping Area provides a place for Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Cub Scouts, Brownies, Youth Groups, and other youth oriented non-profit groups. The camping area is available for rental in the summer or winter. Many Scout groups utilize this area to allow their members to learn winter camping and survival skills. This campground is not open to the public or available for rental by adult groups.

The District encourages event promoters or planners, recreation service providers, and others who may have an idea to contact us. We are always looking for ways to promote and bring more people to our facilities.

To ensure that you have the best possible experience:

- **INFORM:** Let someone know where you are going and when you will return
- PACK-IN, PACK-OUT: Properly dispose of your litter
- TREAD LIGHTLY: Do not damage or remove any vegetation
- **READ:** Recognize posted signs and ordinances and comply with the closed areas and private property postings
- **BE AWARE:** Take note of elevation, temperature, and the changeable weather conditions

PARK RULES

Please help Keep Tahoe Blue and pick up after your pet.

No dogs allowed on playfields (soccer, ballfields or multi-use) for health reasons.

No snowmobiles, OHV or motorized vehicles allowed off paved roads.

- Alcohol is not permitted on or around the ballfields or playground.
- No glass is permitted.
- Smoking is permitted only on paved areas due to health and fire safety rules. No smoking is permitted within 20 ft. of a playground.
- No campfires. Fire is only permitted in BBQ grills.
- · Amplified sound by permit only.
- Walk left on the bike trail.
