<u>Lassen-Feather River</u> <u>Loop</u>	Do the Loop! Drive the scenic highways linking Lassen Park with Highway 70's spectacular Feather River Canyon. You will follow an ancient trail through the land of the Mountain Maidu Indians and pass through the old Gold Rush and lumber towns of Chester, Westwood, Greenville, Crescent Mills and Taylorsville. The mountain landscape, rugged and uniquely beautiful, abounds with Maidu stories. See the park, see the canyon and see the enchanted world that lies between them! <u>Collins Nature Trail</u>	Easy walk. This trail makes two loops through second growth woodland and grassy flood plain. The far end of the trail is six tenths of a mile from the Park.
