#### About the Park


This peaceful campground sits amidst green grass and shade trees on the shore of Goose Lake, a large, shallow lake that straddles the Oregon-California border. Its remote location makes reservations unnecessary. The Lake County railroad, which crosses the park, runs mid-day to the main line in Alturas, California.

Visitors are thrilled by the overwhelming bird life inhabiting the Goose Lake valley. Migratory waterfowl is most abundant in the spring and early summer when stream runoff is at its peak. Mule deer frequent the park, mornings and evenings, during the late summer and fall to feed on the fruit from a homesteader's orchard located within the campground.

The park provides a base from which to explore areas such as Hart Mountain Wildlife Refuge, the 8,500-foot Warner Mountains (just east of the park), and the obsidian beds in the Modoc National Forest of northeast California. Nearby Lakeview (15 miles north) has fuel, groceries, vehicle repair, and restaurants.


