



Artisan Fair

Requirements and Information 2019

1. The Artisan Fair will be held at the gym of the Waterton Community Centre, 201 Cameron Falls Drive (at the junction with Fountain Avenue).
2. Booths will be marked on the floor and will have your name displayed. **Please bring your own table** and if you requested power, an extension cord. 2 chairs will be provided.
3. Booths have to be attended by a vendor/exhibitor at all times to give visitors a valuable experience.
4. Free booths might be located in the hallway and are available for organizations with educational purposes. We are strongly encouraging organizations to include an interactive activity in their display.
5. We reserve the right to select vendors/exhibitors, which fit most the purpose of the Festival. No exhibitor will have exclusive rights to products. Other exhibitors will be allowed to sell a similar product however we will do our best to ensure there is not an abundance of similar items.
6. You can set up your booth from 8:00 am to 10:00 am. We kindly ask you to be finished with set up at 10:00 am. Exhibitors staying for more than one day can leave their booth set up over night. The gym will be locked at night.
7. You can access the gym of the Community Centre from the back door located towards Fountain Avenue. You can park on the driveway to unload. Please park your vehicle on the street once you have unloaded.
8. On the day you leave the fair we ask you to not take down your booth before 4 pm.
9. The Artisan Fair is part of a nature festival either the Waterton Wildflower Festival or the Waterton Wildlife Weekend. The purpose is to promote arts and crafts that represent and cherish nature and aboriginal culture as well as to offer information from Nature Conservation Groups. Our goal is to enhance the experience for the festival's participants and to offer an arts and crafts sale to the public of the surrounding communities as well as tourists visiting Waterton Lakes National Park. The Waterton Artisan Fair with 15 to 20 exhibitors is a small but fine and lovely fair. The spotlight is set at each and every vendor/exhibitor.
10. The Waterton Wildflower Festival and Wildlife Weekend are annual events celebrating nature and wildflowers or wildlife in particular. Nature enthusiast from all over Alberta, Canada the US and even Europe come to Waterton to participate in these well-established events. Both events offer guided hikes and walks, indoor presentations, documentaries, kids programs and workshops related to wildflowers, wildlife and nature in the midst of the spectacular setting of Waterton Lakes National Park.
11. The Waterton Community Center (Old School) is the main hub for both events. The registration, information desk and the fair are located in this building. Some workshops are held in and around the Community Center including family activities. During the fair days a local restaurant will offer food at the Community Centre usually from 10:00 – 16:00.
