

# "Pat's of Waterton" 224 Mount View Road

#3 on the History Walking Tour

This is Waterton's oldest building that was built to service the growing automobile transportation needs of the community and visitors. Originally named "Waterton Motors", it was designed in the era when the parks branch architectural division kept a firm control over the design of Waterton construction, insisting on "Tudor-Rustic" or Swiss chalet-themed structures. The center section was originally open, to allow cars to pull right in for servicing.

### **BUILT: 1928**

**BUILDER:** Park's Architectural Division 1927 (William Cromarty) for Dell Ellison **OF NOTE:** Originally called Waterton Motors, was also operated over the years by Charles Nixon and W. Bogart, Pat Carnell Jr (1953), Bud Sloan (1968), Pat Seerey (1986). Now own by the Wammas family.

#### Parks Canada Heritage Character Statement:

Pat's Garage is the oldest building associated with the transportation theme in the park. It is a good example of a Cromarty design that has not been substantially altered.

## Character Defining Elements

include the white defining elements Character central stone foundation and piers, the exterior with reflecting double entrance pediment and rear wing The art deco stripes on the function. to the heritage character of the building. contribute signage is at present in keeping with the period appearance of this service station. Care should be taken to ensure that new signs are not overly obtrusive. Circular signs should be placed in the gable ends.
