The older building on this site was a grocery store for a number of years until 1944, when it became Waterton's first liquor store. After a new Alberta Liquor Control Board was built in 1961, it went back to being a grocery store, owned at this time by J.A. Greene. Greene sold it to Pearl Irvine in the 1970's, who started a pizza parlour, and her name is on the building to this day.
