## Intimate getaways

Idyllic gardens, scrumptious meals, fun wine tastings and comfy indulgence make these off-the-beaten-path, intimate inns the perfect destination to visit with your significant other.

Since 1852, the **HOTEL FAUCHERE** in eastern Pennsylvania has been serving up an exquisite reason to just come relax. First of all, it's also a Relais and Châteaux hotel, which means that it can stand alone for a simple, charming stay. Kiehl's bath products, original hardwood floors, firm mattresses with 2 inches of feather bedding covered in 100 percent Egyptian cotton and Frette linens is enough to make it hard for anyone to even rise from sleep. But the Delmonico Room calls— named after Louis Fauchère's friends, the Delmonico Brothers, who had the first real



stand-alone hotel restaurant in New York (they also invented the hamburger, Lobster Newburg, Eggs Benedict, and the famed steak, among other things). Start with a pecorino flan with a black truffle essence, and segue into the housemade boudin noir shepherd's pie. The spot-on end to the meal is a baked Fauchere Alaska, served with a citrus and tarragon parfait.
