

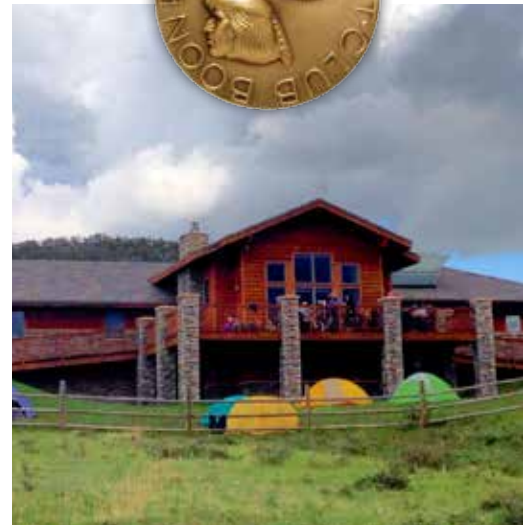

The Rasmuson Wildlife Conservation Center and TRM Ranch is located approximately 10 miles West of Dupuyer, MT along the east slopes of the Rocky Mountain Front. The conservation education program and facilities were developed for everyone who is interested in learning more about science-based wildlife conservation and natural resource management in the outdoors.

THE PRIMARY GOALS OF THE PROGRAM ARE:

- To provide effective outdoor science-based conservation education to facilitate the understanding that conservation is a community endeavor that must be inclusive and cross boundaries of all kinds.
- To foster ethical relationships and appreciation of the natural world, that are committed to shared and sustainable use now and for future generations.
- To promote highly focused and effective teaching tools to enhance the quality of human life and perpetuate our natural heritage.
- To provide students and educators opportunities to build a lasting awareness and understandings for the living and non-living components of ecosystems
- To develop conservation education materials that can be implemented into rural and urban schools throughout the world.
- To offer opportunities to teachers and students to work with researchers and natural resource professionals on conservation related projects
- To promote an understanding and commitment to ethical relationships with wild animals, plants and habitats whether through hunting, angling, observation or study.

The mission of the Lee & Penny Anderson Conservation Education Program is simple; The future of our world depends on choices people make. Education is a key factor in what those choices are. The Boone and Crockett Club's K-12 Conservation Education Program strives to offer perspectives that will foster shared use of natural resources, conservation, sustainable development and stewardship of the land to build a common ground for sustaining healthy ecosystems.

In order to accomplish our mission the Boone and Crockett Club hosts school groups from all over the Globe at its 5,500 square foot education facility, the Rasmuson Wildlife Conservation Center for either 1-day or multi-day programs. The RWCC itself can sleep up to 32 guests in 6 dorm-style bunkrooms, contains a fully equipped commercial kitchen, a large conference and dining area and also includes a laboratory style classroom set up for up to 30 students to work on field related activities. Included in the multi-day program rate is lodging, wireless internet, restrooms with shower facilities, utility room with a washer and dryer as well as use of land line telephones, AV system, projector and drop-down screen. Groups are welcome to bring their own groceries in order to do in house cooking or hire our caterer.
