

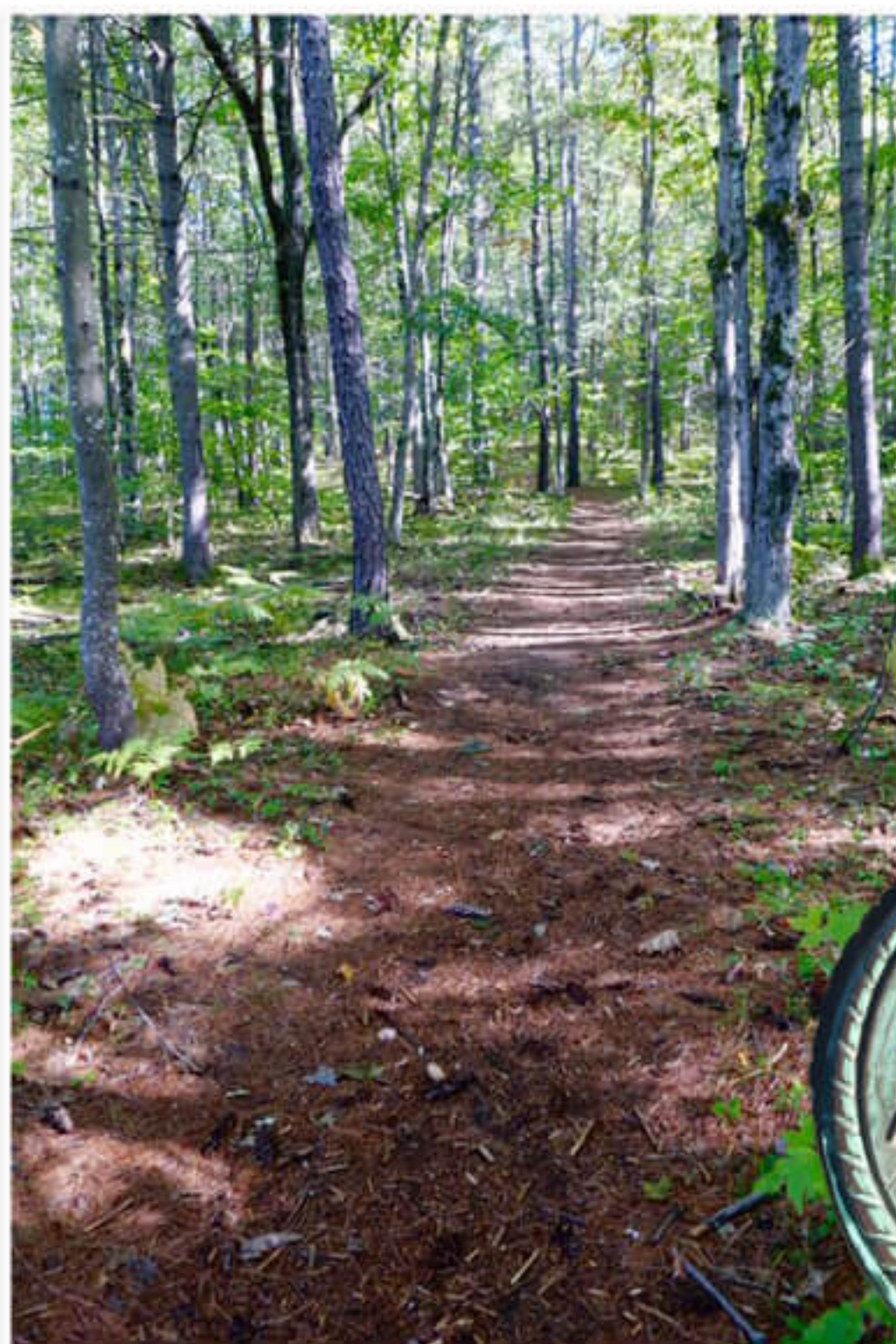

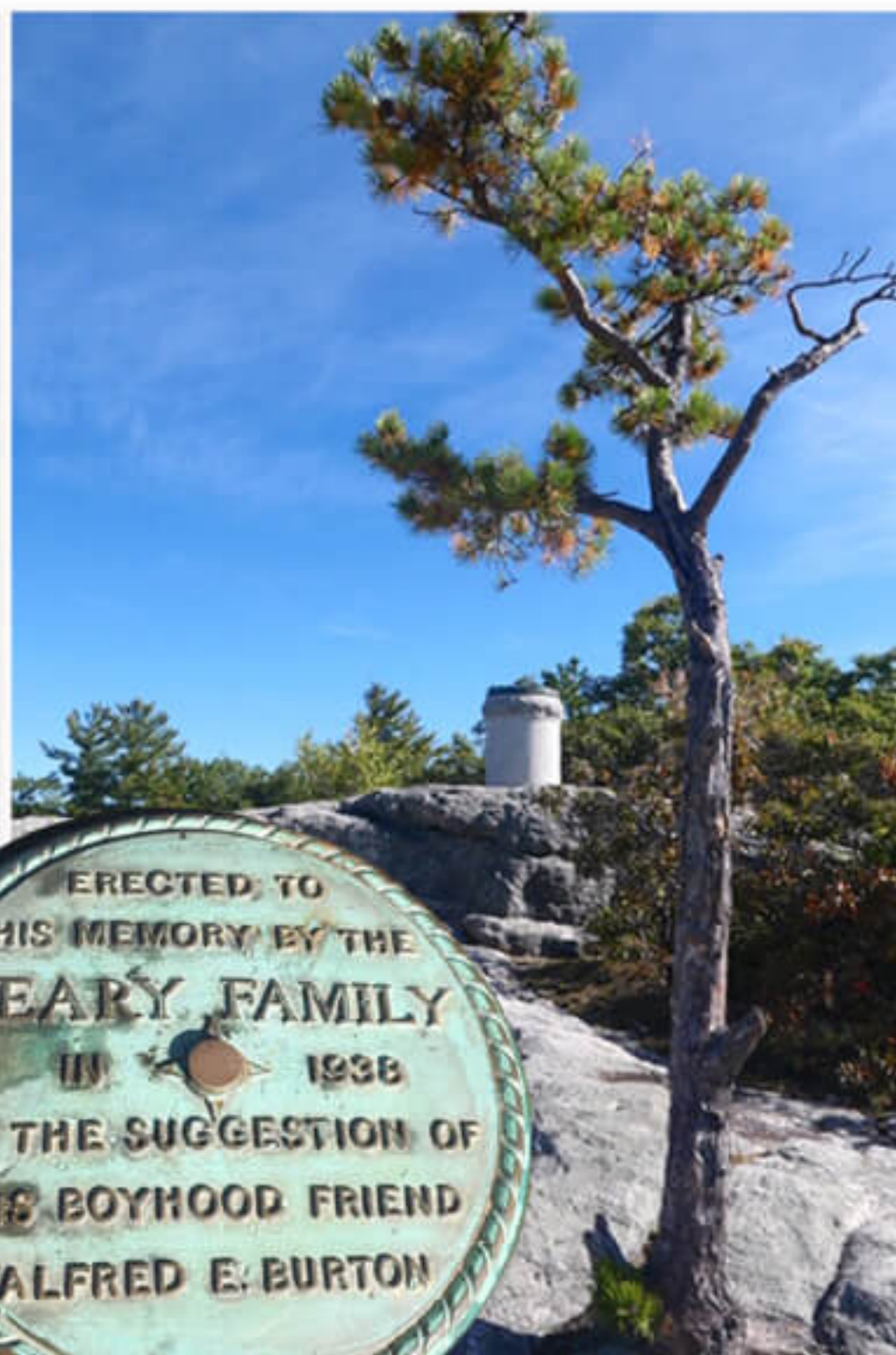


# SHORT CLIMB, BIG VIEW

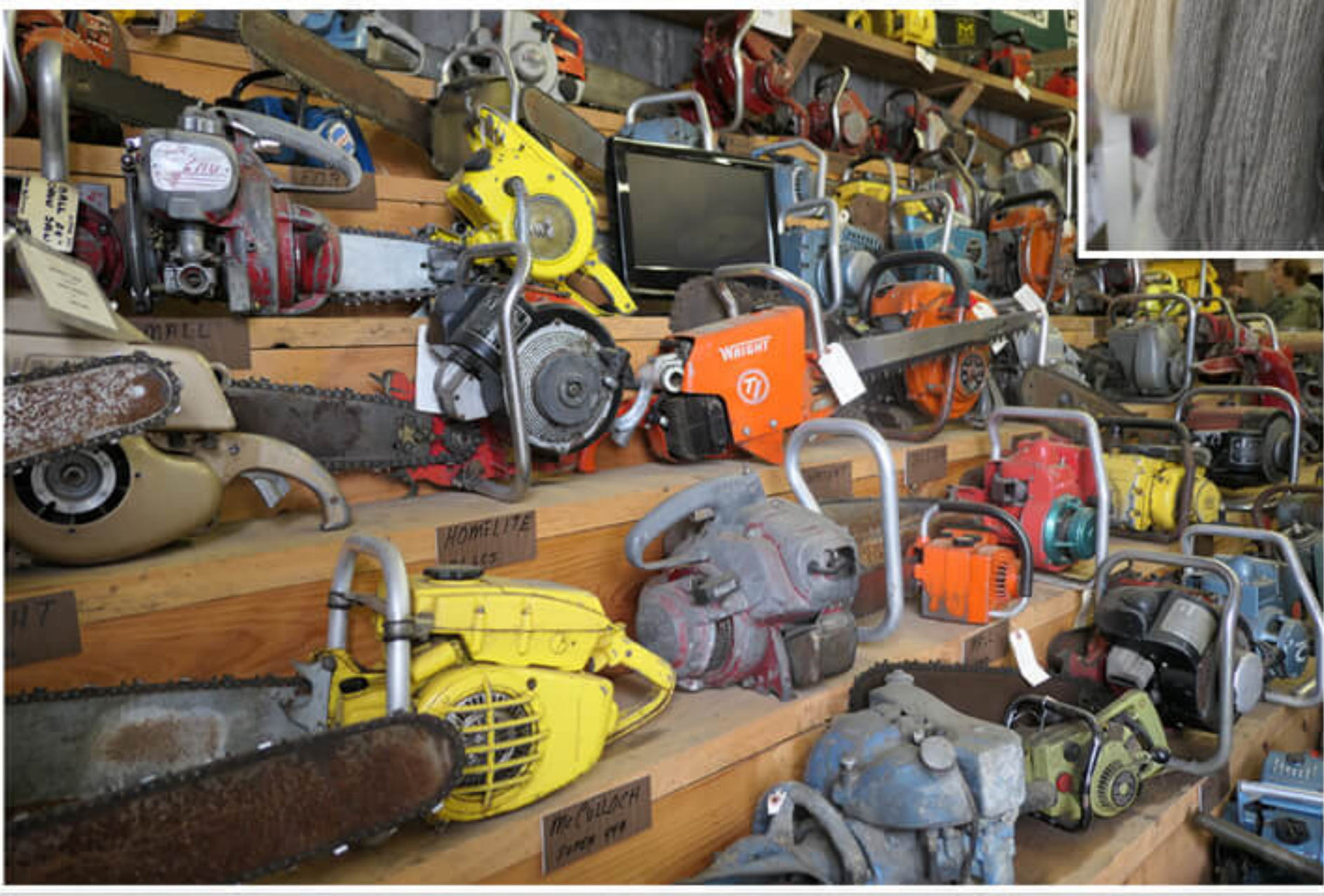
