The Guides of Moose Woods Guide Service have been fishing the greater Katahdin Region for years, and they know just where to bring you! Baxter State Park, alone, has 65 lakes and ponds and has the West Branch of the Penobscot as it's southern boundary. The East Branch of the Penobscot is also nearby, to the East of Baxter. We're talking about an area close to 250,000 acres, that is home to Northern Maine's cold water species of game fish; brook trout, lake trout (togue) and landlocked salmon! But let's not forget there's some great fishing for smallmouth bass and white perch, too!

Maine's fisheries are dynamic and our fisheries biologists have their work cut out for them. Each lake, pond and waterway has its own set of fishing guidelines prescribed by Regional Biologists to sustain a healthy fish population and enhance fishing opportunities for the future.

Although we respect the practice of catch and release, there are some fisheries that have an overabundance of fish, that need fish to be taken. We're happy to oblige both schools of thought depending on the area we're fishing. We're just as happy to release fish back when it makes sense, as we are to have a feed of pan fryers over the camp fire!

We can accommodate the experience level of anyone that desires to fish Katahdin Country. With several options, such as wading the rivers and streams, anchoring a canoe in an eddy of a river, fishing in a pond or lake from a canoe or trolling from a motor boat. We can cater to those that fly fish, to those that are content with fishing with a bobber and worm.

What we offer:

- Expert itinerary planning, detailed checklists, full logistical support, contingency safety planning and Registered Maine Guides that are there to facilitate a safe and enjoyable trip.
- Instruction: Fly casting, fly selection, reading the water, Maine Fishing Laws.
- Over Night Trips: Healthy portions of home cooked meals, snacks, and desserts, prepared outdoors on a camp stove and open fire and catered to your culinary delight.
- REST and RELAXATION. Evening social time and story telling around the campfire. A chance to unwind and get grounded in the North Maine Woods.

What we supply:

- **Day Trips**: Fishing equipment including: Rods, poles, reels, nets, flies, bait, and tackle. Canoes, paddles, and life vests. Lunch and snacks for "Full Day Trips".
- Overnight Trips: Cook stove, kitchen kit, meals, and snacks. First aid kit and water purification. All other items listed in the above "Day Trips". (NOTE: Upon booking, clients will be provided a detailed checklist of gear and personal effects that they will be responsible for bringing on the trip.)

As with any outdoor adventure, Mother Nature deals the cards when it comes to weather and biting insects. Our Guides are there to adapt to those changes in weather and buggy conditions, to keep you as comfortable as the conditions will allow. Following the lead of the Guides and being conscientious of their suggestions will help the group get through the challenges of poor weather and annoying insects. Bringing the necessary personal effects outlined in the provided checklist and employing those items when appropriate will go a long way in ensuring personal comfort.
